AGREEMENT
between
Columbia Basin College
and
Walla Walla Community College

Columbia Basin College (“CBC”) and Walla Walla Community College (“WWCC”) (separately, the “Party”, together the “Parties”) hereby enter into this Customized Articulation Agreement for transfer students from Columbia Basin College to Walla Walla Community College. Students from CBC with an **Associate of Applied Science degree in Agriculture Production** who follow the attached advising recommendations will matriculate into the **Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Agricultural Systems** at Walla Walla Community College.

This Agreement is intended to eliminate duplication of coursework and better integrate programs to ensure a more efficient pathway to graduation. Students who complete CBC’s **Associate of Applied Science degree in Agriculture Production** with at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average will meet the entrance requirements for the **Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Agricultural Systems** at WWCC.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Transfer coursework for students completing the **Associate of Applied Science degree in Agriculture Production** covered by this Agreement will be applied to the WWCC general education requirements. A minimum of sixty (60) credits in general education instruction is required. A minimum of thirty (30) upper division quarter credits within the **Agricultural Systems** degree must be taken at WWCC. A minimum of one hundred and eighty-three (183) quarter credits is required to complete the **Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Agricultural Systems**. The last twelve (12) credits must be earned at WWCC unless waived by the Vice President of Instruction. If students transfer prior to completing the **Associate of Applied Science degree in Agriculture Production**, acceptance of the courses toward a WWCC degree will be evaluated based on transfer course equivalency.

The agreed upon courses of study are outlined in Attachments A and B of this Agreement. Attachment A details the specific *set of requirements to be completed* at CBC and WWCC in order to earn a **Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Agricultural Systems**. Attachment B specifies the required *term-by-term course of study* as offered by CBC and WWCC.

The required course of study may be changed at any time with the mutual written agreement of the participating institutions. At such time, the attachments to this Agreement will be updated. Coursework outlined in this Agreement will be reviewed every two (2) years by both institutions. Unless otherwise agreed upon by both institutions on an individual student basis, students will be responsible for the course of study at CBC and WWCC in effect at the time the student enters the **Associate of Applied Science degree in Agriculture Production** specified in this Agreement. Students are responsible for complying with all applicable policies, rules and regulations of each institution at which they are enrolled.

TUITION AND FEES

Students enrolled in CBC courses will be charged according to the current CBC tuition and fee schedule.

Students enrolled in WWCC courses will be charged according to the current WWCC tuition and fee schedule.



TERM

This Agreement is effective upon execution by CBC and WWCC and will continue thereafter from academic year to academic year unless terminated as provided in this Agreement. However, CBC and WWCC shall review this Agreement every two (2) years, or earlier at the request of either of them, to assess the program and address any changes that may be needed.

TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by either Party upon sixty (60) days' written notice to the other Party. Provided however, such termination shall not become effective for the students already enrolled in the Associate of Applied Science degree in Agriculture Production specified in this Agreement if such termination prevents the completion of the requirements for their AAS at CBC or their BAS degree at WWCC.

NO COST AGREEMENT

This Agreement does not provide for any reimbursement of costs to either CBC or WWCC for services rendered or supplies provided during or at the end of the Agreement term. This Agreement does not provide for either CBC or WWCC to file claims or disputes against the other resulting from any service or supplies provided under this Agreement.

RECORDS MAINTENANCE

Records related to this Agreement may be subject to inspection, review or audit by personnel of both Parties, personnel duly authorized by either Party, the Office of the State Auditor, and federal officials authorized by law. All books, records, documents, and other material relevant to this Agreement shall be retained for the requisite period under record retention schedules, and the Office of the State Auditor, federal auditors, and any persons duly authorized by the Parties shall have full access and the right to examine any of these materials during this period.

Records and other documents, in any medium, furnished by one Party to this Agreement to the other Party, will remain the property of the furnishing Party, unless otherwise agreed. The receiving Party will not disclose or make available this material to any third parties without first giving notice to the furnishing Party and giving it a reasonable opportunity to respond and shall comply with RCW 42.56. Each Party will utilize reasonable security procedures and protections as required by law to assure that records and documents provided by the other Party are not erroneously disclosed to third parties.

GOVERNANCE

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to and under the authority granted by the laws of the state of Washington and any applicable federal laws. The provisions of this Agreement shall be construed to conform to those laws. The venue for any legal action arising out of this Agreement will be Benton and Franklin Counties, Washington.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

To the extent practicable, the Parties shall use their best, good faith efforts to promptly and collaboratively resolve any dispute that may arise in connection with this Agreement, and at the lowest possible level with authority to resolve such dispute. The Parties shall make a good faith effort to continue without delay to carry out their respective responsibilities under this Agreement while attempting to resolve any such



dispute. If, however, a dispute persists and cannot reasonably be resolved, it may be escalated within each institution. In such circumstance, upon notice by either Party, each Party, within five (5) business days shall reduce its description of the dispute to writing and deliver it to the other Party. The receiving Party then shall have three (3) business days to review and respond in writing. In the event that the Parties cannot then agree on a resolution of the dispute, the Parties shall schedule a conference between the respective senior administrators of each institution to attempt to resolve the dispute. In the event the Parties cannot agree on a mutual resolution within fifteen (15) business days, the Parties shall abide by the Governor's dispute resolution process (RCW 43.17.330), if applicable, or collectively shall appoint a third party to evaluate and resolve the dispute and such dispute resolution shall be final and binding on the Parties. The Parties shall equally share the costs, if any, for services obtained to resolve the dispute.

INDEPENDENT CAPACITY

The employees or agents of each Party engaged in the performance of this Agreement shall continue to be employees or agents of that Party and shall not be considered for any purpose to be employees or agents of the other Party. Each Party is responsible for the acts or omissions of its employees, officers, agents and assigns registered volunteers, and is responsible for ensuring that they fulfill their responsibilities under this Agreement in compliance with the provisions of the law and regulations that govern their activities.

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be wholly or partially invalid or unenforceable under applicable law, that provision will be ineffective to that extent only, without in any way affecting the remaining provisions of the Agreement.

NON-DISCRIMINATION

There will be no discrimination in the performance of this Agreement on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, families with children, sex, marital status, sexual orientation (including gender identity), age, genetic history, honorably discharged veteran or military status, or the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a person with a disability, in compliance with (a) Presidential Executive Order 11246, as amended, including the Equal Opportunity Clause contained therein; (b) Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act of 1974, as amended, and the Affirmative Action Clauses contained therein; (c) the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended; and (d) applicable non-discrimination laws of the state of Washington. The Parties further agree they will not maintain facilities which are segregated on the basis of race, color, religion, or national origin in compliance with Presidential



Executive Order 11246, as amended, and will comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, regarding programs, services, activities, and employment practices.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the Parties. No other understandings, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the Parties hereto.




