## Instructions

### Purpose

Pursuant to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Internal Revenue Code (IRC) 6050S and 6051 the College is required to solicit and **students are required to provide Social Security Numbers**. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in civil penalties, assessed by the IRS. The purpose of providing Social Security Numbers is for the issuance of Form 1098-T, Tuition Payments Statement. The College reports the amount you paid for qualifying tuition and fees to both you and the IRS on Form 1098-T. The 1098-T contains information related to claiming a tuition and fee deduction, the Hope Scholarship credit and/or the Lifetime Learning Credit on your taxes. The College also uses Social Security Numbers to verify enrollment, degree(s) and transcripts, administer financial aid, collect student debt, and conduct research. The college will only utilize your Social Security Number in a manner that does not permit personal identification of you. ### Penalties
