The project brought the three hospitals together with a coalition of community leaders to meet a serious community need. The Tri-Cities Health Care Task Force was formed in November of 1993. The new Alliance was formally incorporated in 2002 as a 501c(3) tax-exempt non-profit organization.</li> </ul> <p>The Health Alliance's Community Council considers needs as they arise and authorizes the formation of new committees as warranted. <p>Reports Proposal to name B.R.</p> <p>Budget</p> <p>Governance Institute for Student Success (GISS)</p>	<p><u>President Cummins</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The CBC Music Department presented their proposal to name the CBC Band Room after Don Paul who recently passed away. Don Paul was a full time faculty member 1973-1993 in the Music department. After retirement, he continued his involvement in the CBC Music Department, and received many accolades for his work. Mr. Paul founded the Columbia Basin Concert Band in 1973 and he was a founding member of the Mid-Columbia Brass Quintet in 1979. He was also the originator of the CBC Jazz Unlimited Festival, an event which now brings over 4500 students to the campus over two weekends every April. He was also involved in numerous music productions throughout the Tri-Cities.</li> </ul> <p><u>President Cummins</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Legislature didn't finish on time so effective date for CBC cuts will be August 31, 2011</li> <li>• Classified staff affected, have been met with and some may have bumping rights. Human Resources will help determine that.</li> <li>• Exempt staff – some facing layoff, and trying to be placed elsewhere.</li> <li>• Faculty – Para Ed, Parent Ed being discontinued.</li> <li>• Dental Hygiene – downsizing enrollment.</li> <li>• AOT – Program is being eliminated. Affects 2 tenured faculty. Students remaining in program pipeline will be allowed to finish.</li> <li>• Dean of Basic Skills is retiring at the end of August. Position will not be filled.</li> <li>• Instructional reorganization will possibly take place.</li> <li>• Will use one-time dollars to balance out July &amp; August.</li> </ul> <p>President Cummins thanked the Budget Reduction Committee for their help &amp; professionalism with the tough decisions.</p> <p>Chair Finke thanked everyone for all their work, and for being professional &amp; maintaining a positive attitude at such a difficult time.</p> <p><u>Ty Jones</u></p> <p>GISS Student Achievement Data report presented to Board. For the GISS conference, the state in concert with the institutional researchers at the colleges worked on developing a cohort based approach to SAI data. Came up with three cohorts that reflect what our college does in Washington.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Transfer</u> – Students starting fall quarter who have a transfer intent. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transfer data will be expressed in terms of the main goal of getting students to complete an AA degree.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <u>Workforce</u> – Students starting fall quarter who are enrolled in a workforce program. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Workforce interim goals will be expressed as a way point of 30 credits accumulated towards the main goal of obtaining an AAS degree. Breakdown will include race and ethnicity.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <u>Basic Skills</u> – Students taking a basic skills course in fall quarter. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Basic Skills date is a little different than transfer and workforce data, as there is no interim</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p>Trustee Mitchell moved and Trustee Mayuga seconded to move the naming of the Don Paul Band Room to Consent agenda at the next regular Board meeting.
