- According to POLICY TYPE: GOVERNANCE PROCESS GP-7 – POLICY TITLE: *NAMING OF FACILITIES* – Advisory recommendations for awarding the honor pursuant to this policy shall be made by an ad-hoc advisory committee appointed by the Board of Trustees.
