	<p>Hispanic RS students is below the percentage of Hispanics at that high school. Conclusion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • College enrollment among recent high school graduates in the Tri-Cities area is, overall, similar to state enrollment rates, although there is a considerable variation among the six local schools. • At each of the high schools, enrollment at CBC exceeds that of any 4-year college in the state and far exceeds enrollment at any other community college. Those choosing to enroll at CBC often have high school GPAs of less than 3.0; those with higher GPAs tend to enroll at a 4-year college. Running Start enrollments are relatively low at Kennewick and show a declining trend for both Kennewick and Hanford. Running Start enrollments among Hispanics are considerably lower than for Whites at all the schools. • In terms of improving access to CBC, based on the ERDC and Running Start data, there are several groups of students whose lower enrollment rates suggest potential targeting for CBC communications and marketing efforts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students from Pasco high school who enroll in college at lower rates than the other five schools. Nearly 60% of Pasco graduates with GPAs of less than 3.0 do not enroll in college at all. ○ Students from Hanford high school who enroll at CBC in lower rates than the other high schools. While it is true that many Hanford graduates enroll in 4-year colleges, nearly 50% of Hanford graduates with GPAs below 3.0 do not enroll in college at all. ○ Across all six schools, over half of the graduates with GPAs of less than 3.0 fail to enroll in college at all. ○ Low and declining rates of participation in Running Start by Kennewick and Hanford suggest efforts should be made to increase their rates of participation. ○ Efforts should be expanded to increase RS participation among Hispanics. 	
<p>Discussion TACTC Nominations –Transforming Lives Awards</p>	<p><u>President Cummins</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Three nominations were discussed, and the decision was made to nominate Ms. Daphne Larios as CBC’s choice for this award. • The TACTC Transforming Lives: Building America Awards recognize current or former students whose lives have been transformed by attending a Washington state community or technical college. The TACTC Awards Committee will select five winners from the nominations submitted by the Washington community and technical colleges. • All nominees will be invited to attend, at TACTC’s expense, the TACTC Legislative Contact Conference (January 29, 2013, at the Red Lion Hotel in Olympia), where they will be honored during the Transforming Lives: Building America Dinner.
