	staff, and CBC faculty. Five core themes were developed with corresponding objectives	
	and objective indicators as a means of gauging our college's efforts to enhance student	
	veteran success. Further, the core themes have been aligned with our institutional	
	commitment to the US Department of Education's 8 Keys to Success. To date, CBC is	
	among 250 colleges and universities which have adopted the 8 Keys, and is the only 8	
	Keys to Success site in Washington.

	As CBC continues to serve a growing number of student veterans, the strategic plan	
	developed will allow CBC to address existing student veteran needs, and encourages our	
	college to modify practices that address emerging student veteran needs. Much of the

	efforts which are not easily measured by their nature, such as trust. While CBC is set in	
	a dynamic and complex system, Tri-Cities veterans can trust CBC to be proactive and
