ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Pre-Dentistry emphasis at CBC is designed for students who want to become dentists. The Doctor of Dental Sciences (DDS) degree, or its equivalent, must be earned to become a dentist. While the requirements below meet standards for many transfer schools and dental programs, students wishing to earn the DDS degree must determine their schools of interest and complete the required coursework for those programs.

OUT OF CLASS TO DO'S

- Begin researching transfer and dental schools of interest early to be certain you meet their prerequisite course requirements and admission deadlines.
- Consider working with the CBC Career Services Center to find an internship, observation/shadowing experience, or a job in the dental field.
- Visit the Academic Success Center for quiet study space, small group study, supplemental instruction and tutoring assistance.

Length of Program

Full-time students can complete the AA-DTA in two years. Dental programs typically require an additional four years of school post-bachelor's degree at an accredited DDS program.

General dentists provide a wide array of services for the continued oral health of their patients, focusing on preventing and stopping diseases through regular examinations. General dentists diagnose and treat patients, potentially offering more advanced treatments, such as bridgework, fitting for dentures, cavity fillings, and root canals — or referring the patient to specialized dentists.
