

# **Student Ambassador Application 2025-2026**

#### **Position Announcement & Description**

The Student Ambassador program at Columbia Basin College began in the 2000-2001 academic year. Ambassadors play a key role in attracting new students to the campus and fostering a college-going culture in the community. They support the CBC Outreach office by assisting with a variety of events throughout the year, including (but not limited to):

- Leading campus tours
- Assisting with CBC Outreach & Recruitment efforts such as Open Houses, the Benton-Franklin Fair, and other community and school events
- Promoting early college awareness in local elementary and middle schools
- Supporting day-to-day office operations, including reaching out to prospective students via email and phone
- Serving as a public face, representing what it means to be a CBC Hawk to various audiences

#### To apply, you must:

- Submit a completed application, resume, and two letters of recommendation
- Be enrolled full-time at CBC (a minimum of 12 credits per quarter)
- Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5
- Have completed a financial aid application (FAFSA or WASFA)
- Agree to dedicate 10 hours a week to the program and fully participate for the entire academic year (fall, winter, and spring quarters).
- If you do not meet one of the above criteria, you must submit a written statement explaining why you do not meet the requirement and why you still believe you are qualified for this role.

## **Traits of Strong Ambassador Candidates:**

The CBC Outreach office values diversity within both our office and campus community, seeking students from a wide range of backgrounds, experiences, goals, and perspectives. While embracing diversity in our candidates, we also look for specific traits that contribute to success in the program:

- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Effective time management and ability to balance multiple priorities
- Initiative, dependability, resourcefulness, and creativity with a proactive and open-minded attitude
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team
- A genuine desire to learn through engagement with CBC campus services, resources, and activities, as well as the ability to effectively work with children



#### **Important Dates:**

Applications will be accepted via email at cbcoutreach@columbiabasin.edu until **April 30, 2025**. Applications will be reviewed to ensure they are complete, and all requirements have been met.

## Incomplete applications will not be considered for interview.

In-person interviews will take place in May/June with selected 2025-2026 Ambassadors required to meet for workshops in early August. The Ambassador team will be required to assist with the Benton Franklin Fair the week of August  $19^{th} - 23^{rd}$ .

# Payment:

Ambassadors selected for the program will receive a non-need-based tuition waiver for up to 15 credits per quarter, based on state tuition rates per quarter. *Selection for the program does not guarantee continued participation*. Ambassadors' performance will be evaluated quarterly to determine eligibility for continued service.

This is a service-based program, not a scholarship. We are seeking individuals who can commit to 10 hours per week and are committed to engaging in our campus culture while helping others envision their future college experience through interactions with the Ambassador team.
